The Tuesday evening vesper service was opened by a song, "Oh, Eyes that Are Weary," by Miss Longman. Dr. Alexander spoke on "The College Student" and "Bible Study." He spoke especially of the intellectual study of scriptures. He emphasized the fact that a nation leaves us the greatest gift in the form of its literature which represents its ideals. The Hebrew people left us a precious record of their inner life, he said. In other respects they were not especially great.

Speaking of the methods of studying the Bible, he suggested that all study be supplemented by the essays of the leading Bible students of our time.
