## Y. M. C. A. WORKS IN ITS ONE COMMUNITY

### Does Concentrated University Work While City Organization Spreads.

Some do not understand the relation that exists between the University and the City Young Men's Christian Association, and for this reason an explanation may be in place, especially as the University association is now making a campaign for funds. The University association is a separate and distinct organization from the city association and has its own board of directors, budget, secretarial force, etc., and carries on its work independently of the city association. The reason for this lies in the fact that the student community standing as it does as more or less of a unity can better be reached by a separate organization, especially since student life and problems are considerably different than those of the young men of the city in general.

That the work is thus separately organized does not imply in the least that there is anything less than hearty co-operation and good-will. An illustration of this, the joint financial campaign which the two associations are planning to carry out among the citizens of Lincoln. Another example of the co-operation is shown in the fact that next Sunday the two organizations will give a program in the Oliver, at which the captain of the Haskell football team will speak. This will be a meeting of special interest to the student young men.

Many of the student young men desire to join the city association in order to take advantage of the dormitory, swimming pool, etc. To all such as are members of the University association the city association makes a reduction of fee equal to the fee of the University association. The city association also provides a special nine months' membership ticket for students at \$7.50 whereas the twelve-month ticket cost \$10.
