FINAL REHEARSAL TODAY

DRAMATIC CLUB MAKES LAST PREPARATION FOR PRODUCTION TOMORROW NIGHT.

PLAY "SERVANT IN THE HOUSE"

Have Been Working Hard for Five Weeks With Daily Rehearsals Last Few Weeks.

The final rehearsal for "The Servant in the House," the play to be produced by the University of Nebraska Dramatic club, will be held this afternoon on the Temple stage. For the past five weeks the cast has been working hard and tomorrow all will be in readiness for the performance.

The play is by Charles Rann Kennedy, and is a keen satire of certain tendencies in the church, together with a presentation of moral and religious truth.

The story is of an English country parish vicar, who finds his church in need of moral uplifting and physical rebuilding. Yet he accuses himself of being a coward and a hypocrite in the treatment of one of his brothers. His brother is a drunken sot, engaged in the unsavory occupation of cleaning the drains. The vicar and his wife adopt his child, Mary, into their family, but they keep the child ignorant of her father. Word comes that the Bishop of Banares, who at the end proves to be the vicar's brother, is coming to help him in the upbuilding of the church. The vicar's wife has invited her brother, the Bishop of Lancashire, to come and help in the work.

John, the "Servant in the House," is an Indian butler clad in oriental robes. He is revealed to the audience as the Bishop of Banares. The Bishop of Lancashire, supposedly to be a good and kind, outlines his plans to Madison, the famous bishop, where in there is a "rakeoff for the two bishops."

The Servant's influence begins to change the disordered household of the conscience-stricken vicar and an ambitious wife. He drives out the
