FIRST CHANCELLOR DEAD

DR. A. B. BENTON SUCCUMBS TO
OLD INJURY ON NEW
YEAR'S MORN.

GUIDED U. OF N. IN FIRST YEARS

As the First Chancellor in 1871 He
Held the Helm Firmly for Five
Years—Resided in Lincoln.

Allen Richardson Benton, Ph. D., first chancellor of the Nebraska State University, and for forty years one of the most prominent educators of the west, died on the first day of the new year at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. J. S. Dales, 1745 A street. His death which was due to old age, had been expected for some time.

Despite the fact that the death of Chancellor Benton was expected it cast a shadow in many a home in Lincoln when the sad news was announced on New Year's morning.

In 1871 Dr. Benton came to Nebraska from an Indiana university and was elected first chancellor of the University of Nebraska. He held the post at this institution until 1876 when he returned to Indianapolis to renew his connection with Butler university. For the past five years ex-Chancellor Benton has lived in retirement at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Dales, on A street. Five years ago while awaiting a street car in Indianapolis he fell heavily to the pavement. It was the end to an active career and since that day Mr. Benton has been confined almost continually to the home. The body was taken to Indianapolis for interment.

Howard Expresses Regret.

Prof. George Elliott Howard expresses the reverence and respect felt by all when he says: "It was fortunate for the state that Dr. A. R. Benton was called to the difficult task of organizing the University of Nebraska. He was a refined gentleman; a scholar accomplished in the humanities of his day; a good Christian and a good citizen. As a result, during his term of service the University of Nebraska was solidly planted. It passed safely through the first and critical stages of constitutional growth. It struck its roots deep in the affection of the people."

As a faithful and efficient social servant, as a conscientious and prudent institution builder, the name of A. R. Benton is forever enrolled among the most honored and most beloved makers of the commonwealth.
