From the above it will be noted that every Husker has scored more baskets from the field than his opponents. Nebraska has had 75 fouls called upon them, 38 of which were "personal" and 37 "technical." Of these 75 chances the enemy have had to score by the free route, 44 have been converted into tallies. Nebraska's opponents have had 49 fouls called upon them, from which the Huskers threw 19 free baskets.

The Huskers have had one point awarded them and have lost one by the same means.

The opponents, in the eight games so far this season, have scored 45 field goals, worth 2 points each, 44 free throws, and had one point awarded, making a total of 135 points.

The Huskers have scored 124 baskets from field, counting for 248 points. They have made 19 free throws and had one point awarded, making a total of 258 points.
