The rebuttal speeches were very largely a brief summary and reemphasis of the points brought out in direct argument, besides a narrowing of the issues, and a final clash on the question of whether experience with woman suffrage in states like Colorado and Wyoming had been successful, and on this question, in the opinion of the judges, the weight of authority, reason and presentation, was clearly with the Freshman team.

Some of the listeners who had sat in inter-class debate audiences before remarked that this was the first time they had ever seen a unanimous verdict for the negative side of the woman suffrage question, the affirmative of which has of late years received a larger and larger number of converts. To this observation some of the judges replied that this was the first time they had ever heard so much of the best evidence on the negative side of this question brought forth. There was a tendency among those who knew to ascribe the superior weight of the Freshman evidence to the combined efforts of the team and Doctor Maxey, and one of the Sophomore speakers, in his closing speech, frankly admitted that they were not equipped with any of the doctor's jokes


