**HUSKERS RUN AWAY WITH LAST GAME**

**Farmer Boys From Iowa Unable to Stand the Pace Set by the Stiehm Roller.**

The last game of the formal basketball season was played Saturday evening when the Cornhuskers romped over the Ames Aggies by a score of 41 to 13. The Iowa farmers were outclassed from the opening whistle and were never able to overtake the victorious Cornhuskers, and the first half ended with the score standing 17 to 3. The last half was even worse for the Ames basket tossers than the preceding half and Nebraska's superiority in all departments of the game was very marked.

Captain Ross Haskell covered himself with glory in the final Ames game of his college days and gave a thrilling exhibition of basketball. He located the basket five times while being guarded by Captain Hansell of Ames, who is regarded as one of the best players in the Missouri Valley Conference. **Nebraska Claims the Missouri Valley Championship by Precedent and Record.**

Kansas has played more games than Nebraska, but has lost two. Nebraska has a clean slate in its seven Conference games. The Jayhawkers do not seem inclined to settle the honor question by post-series games. The Nebraska squad was the undisputed champions in 1913 and 1912, and athletic authorities see no grounds for a Kansas claim of championship.

Without a doubt the last game of the season will be played with Wesleyan at the auditorium Thursday night.
