This beneficial work very naturally falls to the University because the department concerned is directly connected with surveys and other investigations of resources and industries. The department here checks with various state and federal departments in determining the validity of operations of land companies. It supplements data received from these sources by detailed field examinations.

matters pertaining to land and development therefrom.

As a result of this service to the state it is now evident that the fraudulent land dealers are not seeking to sell land in Nebraska. In some cases where the department has uncovered hazy transactions and have called the companies' attention to it, they have fallen over themselves to straighten up at once.

In this matter of developing "blue sky" legislation, the University of Nebraska has taken a leading position. The members have presented the need for such legislation before many state and national meetings.

Not only the department above connected with public welfare, but many other departments are also interested. as for example, the Legislative Reference Bureau, the Agricultural Extension, the University Extension, and special lines of activity by a number, of other departments.


