"Excellent material," is what those who saw the senior play tryouts say of the cast which is to present "The Fortune Hunter." Parts have been definitely assigned and the line-up looks like a star combination all the way through. Some of the doubters were afraid it might be difficult to get a good cast, but after inspecting the line-up they all agree that it looks like the best amateur cast that has been gotten together in Lincoln for a long time.

Competition for places was keen, and in some instances the judge had a most difficult proposition in choosing between those who seemed almost equally good. But an arrangement has been made which will make use of the best material and in every instance the players are well fitted to the characters they will have to portray.

The cast is getting off with a running start by starting rehearsals tonight. They were called together yesterday for a few minutes to determine times for practice and are starting off to eat up the play in short order. "Rockie" Ammerman, who is to play the lead, has already begun to practice looking like a dissipated spend-thrift for the first act.

The manuscript parts have arrived from New York and by paying \$50.00 have been made available for immediate use. Each player has a separate copy of his lines, making it unnecessary to copy parts. The manuscript parts are at the reserve desk in the library.

Quick work will be necessary to get the play ready for presentation in the first week in May, but the cast prefers a short period of concentrated effort to dragging practices out over six or eight weeks. The play is to be given in connection with Ivy Day, which comes on May 6. It is thought that the combination of these two big events at one time will add prestige to both of them and make them more successful.
