Tonight in the Temple Theatre will be held the commencement exercises. The speaker will be Joseph Wing, of Mechanicsburg, Ohio. Mr. Wing is a prominent agriculturist and has written several books on this subject. The music for the evening is in the hands of Mrs. Raymond. - The Class Day program began with a reminiscence luncheon at the Lincoln Hotel at 12:30. Only seniors took part in this luncheon. The toasts consisted of short talks on reminiscences. The program for the afternoon started at 3 p. m. in the assembly room. The Farm Band played an overture and then H. C. Bull, class president, gave the welcome address. The class history was given by means of a reflectroscope. The prophesy was then given by about a dozen of the class. They pretended to be a group of the class meeting a number of years later than the present. They began talking over old times and gradually unfolded the history, or rather the future, of the entire class. The band then led the march to the senior rock, a large granite boulder which is the class gift. Upon it is a tablet which gives a map of the Farm campus as it now stands.
