SHORT BALLOT CONFERENCE AT STATE HOUSE

Faculty Members and Prominent Editors of the State on the Program

A "short ballot" conference will be held at the state house, Lincoln, January 15, 1915. This conference, which is said to be the first of its kind ever held in Nebraska, is being promoted and will be held under the auspices of the Nebraska Popular Government League.

At the afternoon session the discussion will be led by F. L. Bollen of Crofton, former state representative, and chairman of the Popular Government League; Victor Rosewater of Omaha, editor of the Omaha Daily Bee; L. E. Aylsworth of Lincoln, professor of political science; F. A. Brogan of Omaha, former president of the State Bar Association, and W. L. Locke of Lincoln, associate editor State Journal.

At the evening session, J. N. Norton of Polk, state representative; R. Beecher Howell of Omaha, Republican national committeeman; E. L. Havellone of Beatrice, treasurer of Gage county; A. E. Sheldon of Lincoln, director legislative reference bureau, and C. A. Sorensen, law student and secretary of the Popular Government League, will lead the discussion.

- "The Short Ballot as a Means to Democracy."
- "The Need of the Short Ballot in Nebraska."
- "The Application of the Short Ballot to State Offices."
- "The Short Ballot and the Railway Commission."
- "The Short Ballot and the Judiciary."
- "The Short Ballot and Legislative Reform."
- "The Short Ballot and County Offices."
- "The Merit System of Appointment as a Corollary to the Short Ballot."
- "The Direct Primary and the Short Ballot."
- "The purpose of this conference," says C. A. Sorensen, secretary, "is to crystallize the rapidly growing sentiment in favor of the short ballot. It is expected that the conference will appoint a committee to work with the legislature."
