If any one group of people should appreciate the significance of Mother's Day more than another it is University men and women. Here, too, we may catch a glimpse of her hope and ambitions for us that will be an inspiration to us to be the best that we can be. Who can fail who seeks to live up to the expectations of his mother?

So as University men and women, let us make the most of this Mother's

Day. May it mean the enlargement of the appreciation of the mother love that will vitalize our lives and make us better sons and daughters and better members of society.
