**Y. M. C. A. SECRETARY GOES TO WAR ZONE**

R. L. Ewing Will Sail From New York June 26th—Glen Everts to Have Charge of the Work Here

R. L. Ewing, secretary of the Y. M. C. A., sails from New York on June 26 for the European war zone to do Y. M. C. A. work with the British army. Glenn Everts has been employed to take charge of the association work during the summer.

At New York, Secretary R. L. Ewing will be joined by H. L. Heinzeman, secretary of the International Y. M. C. A. Committee for the Rocky Mountain States; C. W. Whitehair, secretary at Cornell, and F. N. D. Buchanan, secretary at Pennsylvania State University. He will be back the middle of September. As yet he does not know whether he will be with the troops from India or with the British army proper.
