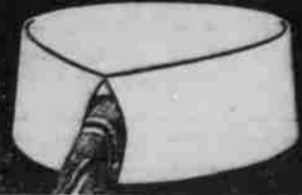

**RED CROSS APPEALS FOR AID.**

**Must Discontinue Relief Work Unless Help Comes Quickly.**

Washington—An appeal from American citizens in Mexico City urging the American Red Cross not to discontinue its relief work there has been made public here by Miss Mabel T. Boardman, chairman of the Red Cross national relief board. Since the petition was drafted a contribution of \$25,000 from the Rockefeller foundation has replenished an exhausted fund of the Red Cross for Mexican relief, and Charles J. O'Connor, in charge of the society's headquarters at Mexico City, has been notified that all reasonable demands can be met for the next thirty days. "We learn our relief work will stop unless further funds are raised in the United States," said the appeal. "For humanity's sake, we beg you to appeal again to the American people."

**Freak Plants in Well**

Weeping Water. — Freak plant growths which are proving so numerous this season showed up in a peculiar form in a well on the farm of Tom Grummel, a Nemaha county farmer. While examining for trouble in the pump, workmen found the wooden tubing of the well almost closed with a heavy matting of roots and fungus. The condition existed along the tubing for almost the entire depth of the well, and it was necessary to put in entirely new tubing.
