**WRESTLING SCHEDULE
 HEAVY THIS YEAR**

Meets with Iowa, Ames, Doane, Wesleyan and Western Intercollegiate

The Nebraska wrestling team is to have a heavy schedule, as announced by Captain Otoupalik. Doane and Wesleyan will furnish the opening contests, with Iowa, Ames, and the Middle Western Intercollegiate tournament at Minneapolis to follow.

The Husker mat artists, sixty strong, are working hard for places

on the team. Many of the letter men from last year are being hard pushed for places, and Nebraska is assured of a good representation.

Dual meets with Doane and Wesleyan will be staged in the near future. From these meets and the work of the squad, the team to meet Iowa will be picked. The formidable Hawk-eyes are preparing to wipe the earth with the Cornhuskers March 11, when the teams meet in the Armory. This meet has been scheduled as an additional attraction during the last day of the state high school basketball tournament.

The following Saturday, March 18, the team will meet Ames at Ames. Reports from Ames are that a large squad is out working for a victory over Nebraska. March 25, at Minne-

apolis, is held the Middle Western Intercollegiate Gymnastic and Wrestling tournament. Last winter this meet was held at Lincoln, and all the big schools of the middle west participated.

The announcement of the Oregon Aggie game has been pleasant news for the Cornhusker letter men of this year and a large crop of would-be letter men. Just when all the football men were planning their good times, Guy Reed, our amiable manager, says that only eighteen will be taken. That is, only eighteen will be paid for—we refuse to predict how many will be taken! With the Oregon game third on the 1916 schedule, there ought to be some fine competition among the rank and file for those eighteen places.

Just to a casual observer, it seems that the game with the Oregon Aggies, secured largely through the influence of Dr. Stewart, our new coach, is an indication of the high esteem

in which he is held by the western school. The Oregon Aggie-Nebraska game will be inter-sectional and give the teams of the east and middle west a good basis for comparing the football of the east and west.
