FRATERNITIES AND SCHOLARSHIP

The statistics given in today's Nebraskan show that there is great room for improvement in the matter of the scholarship of fraternities. The contrast between the record of the fraternities and that of the sororities is decidedly to the advantage of the latter. It is also rumored that many of this year's fraternity pledges have been forced to withdraw because they did not make the required number of hours. It is easy to see a causal relationship between these two situations.

We believe that the low scholastic standing of fraternities is due to two main reasons; fraternities are too hasty in pledging men, and they do not exercise the proper supervision after pledging.

A good high school record, or indeed a good appearance at first meeting are sufficient to get many freshmen the coveted fraternity bid. Little care is taken to determine whether the prospective member has the staying qualities that make him desirable. Then when he is once pledged, little care is taken to see that he is following the lines he expected to follow when he entered the university.

Until these two features of fraternity life are properly emphasized, such organizations will always be open to severe criticism. It is to be hoped that sophomore pledging, which is to go into effect next year, will do much to remedy this condition.

THE GALLERY AGAIN
