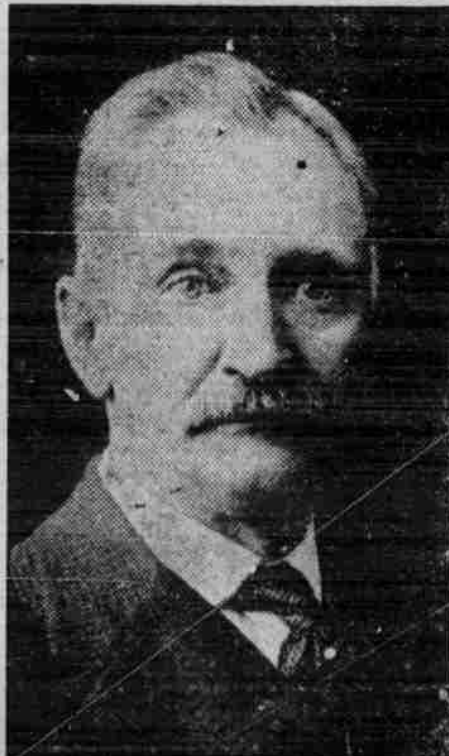

STATE RAILWAY COMMISSIONER



As State Senator in 1907-9 he stood by the people. He introduced several bills that were enacted into laws. He worked and voted for every constructive measure and as Chairman of the Committee on Public Lands and Buildings, University and Normal Schools, Asylums, Schools for the Deaf, Dumb and Blind, he recommended and helped in obtaining appropriations for buildings at Omaha, Lincoln, Beatrice, Hastings, Kearney, Norfolk and Wayne. During his investigation into the affairs of the State University, he discovered that the students were compelled to purchase their books at certain book stores at exorbitant prices.
