The American Relief Clearing l'Iouse in l'alis has chartered a ves sel to transport the Serbian refugees to the island of Corfu. The French Government has endorsed this plan and agreed to provide a safe convoy. The work of transferring the refugees has been in progress since the last week in

But funds are urgently needed to carry on the work: the Allied Nations are not in a position to bear the entire expense of caring for these refugees.
