

The Prohibitory Amendment will appear at the top of the ballot substantially as follows:

Shall the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended by adding thereto the following?

On and after May first, 1917, the manufacture, the sale, the keeping for sale or barter, the sale or barter under any pretext, of malt, spirituous, vinous, or any other intoxicant liquors, are for-ever prohibited in this state, except for medicinal, scientific, mechanical, or sacramental purposes.
