over courses of study within its own college. We think, however, that when the faculty of any school recommends a change within its field, such change should be made unless the college faculty distinctly and for reasons given disapproves. It would seem that if a group of courses is separate enough to call for a separate school, the initiative as to the affairs of that school should be left with its own faculty and administrative officers.

In view of needs and conditions as they have been presented to us, and of all the foregoing considerations, therefore, we are not in favor of establishing new colleges in the University at the present time. Respectfully submitted,

Banquet of 50—Address by Chancellor Elliott, '95 of Montana

A photograph taken at the Colorado University of Nebraska alumni club banquet held at the Shirley hotel at Denver, November 3, has been received at the alumni office.

The banquet was held in honor of E. C. Elliott, '95, A. M. '97, chancellor of the University of Montana, and H. C. Parmelee, '97, A. M. '99, president of the Colorado state school of mines, at Golden. About fifty were present.

Rev. Oren W. Fifer, '89, A. M. '95, president of the club, introduced the speakers, and called attention to the fact that three of the heads of prominent institutions of learning were at one time and at the same period specialists in the department of chemistry at the University of Nebraska, the third being Chancellor Avery.

Chancellor Elliott gave a thirty minute talk in which he told of his own college days, and compared college life then to it now. He mentioned the fact that such an education costs more at the present time.
