Early spring migratory arrivals—Bluebird, robin, song sparrow, red-winged blackbird, meadowlark, blue jay, flicker, belted kingfisher, mourning dove, killdeer.

Medium spring migratory arrivals—Brown thrasher, house wren, cedar waxwing, barn swallow, purple martin, yellow-headed blackbird, chimney swift, sparrow hawk, green heron, Franklin gull.

Late spring migratory arrivals—Wood thrush, catbird, rose-breasted grosbeak, Baltimore oriole, orchard oriole, ruby-throated hummingbird,

nighthawk, red-headed woodpecker, yellow-billed cuckoo, spotted sandpiper. Birds which may be found in June: Mockingbird, scarlet tanager, indigo bunting, bobolink, whippoorwill.
