#### Junior Battery Features

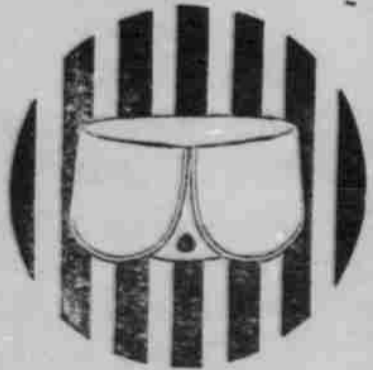
