MOBILIZE CADETS IN WAR STRENGTH CO.

Promotions for Next Year Will Not be Made Until New Semester Begins

One company of war strength has been organized in the military department and will carry on the training until the end of the year under the direction of Sergeant William Allen, acting head of the department since the departure of Captain Samuel Parker, commandant, for Fort Snelling. Adolph Blunk, '17, is major of the battalion as it remains, H. B. Whitfield, '17, is captain, and Arthur Mickey, '18, is first lieutenant.

The annual appointments in the department will not be made until the beginning of the work next year and will be left to the commandant who is selected to have charge of the work here at that time. Captain Parker will not be back next year, according to advice from the office yesterday.

Orders have been sent out from the headquarters at Washington directing special training for the cadets at the present and everything is conducted in a manner which will be most helpful to the training of the men for service. Orders have been issued all over the country forbidding the distributing of any more supplies, arms and ammunition to educational institutions and rifle clubs.

The present Red Cross membership in the United States is 250,000. To support its field and base hospitals, its doctors and nurses, and to provide the necessities of military relief, the society needs a membership of at least \$1,000,000. A fee of \$1 is charged for annual members, \$2 for subscribing members, \$25 for life membership. Dean Burnett is chairman of the farm committee. Prof. L. W. Chase, Prof. W. W. Burr, Prof. Alice Loomis and Mrs. Emma Reed Davison are members of the committee.
