business shall be transacted in accordance with Roberts' Rules of Order. The minutes of each meeting shall be recorded in a permanent class record book which must be returned to the student activities office, immediately after the meeting.

No action taken by the class shall be considered legal unless recorded in the permanent record book and signed by the president and secretary.

#### Article IV.—Committees

Section 1. Regular—First semester: Hop, prom, class play, class pin, athletics and debate.

Second semester—Invitation, cap and gown, social, gift, hop, picnic, Ivy Day (1 general, 2 campus program, 3 afternoon); alumni day.

Sec. 2. Special Committees—Special committees shall be appointed as necessity arises.

Sec. 3. Chairman of committees shall make reports to the executive board at least one day before each class meeting.

#### Article V.—Alumni Officers

Section 1. Election and Duties—At the last regular meeting of the year there shall be election of alumni officers consisting of a president and secretary-treasurer, who shall co-operate with the University alumni association.

#### Article VI.—Amendments

A two-thirds vote of those present at a regular meeting of the class shall be required for amending this consti-

tution. Any proposed amendment must be read at a previous regular meeting, and published in at least one issue of The Daily Nebraskan before being voted on.
