COMMITTEE WILL CANVASS WOMEN FOR LIBERTY LOAN

Easy Terms to Be Provided for Purchasers of Any Priced Bond

A special committee with Prof. Minnie T. England of the department of economics as chairman has been formed to canvass the women of the University for the second liberty loan. A bond may be bought by one individual or from two to five people may buy one jointly. The minimum that will be accepted for a person's devotion of a bond will be \$10. All sums below this will go to the Red Cross liberty bond fund. The purchasers may pay the entire sum down or \$1 down, \$9 on November 15, \$20 on December 15, and \$20 on January 15. Still easier terms are offered i. e.—\$1 down and \$1 a week for each \$50 bond. All new names will be added to the list in U102.
