**University of Illinois
Puts 490 on Probation**

As a stimulus toward better work and as a first attack against loafers, the University of Illinois has adopted a system whereby students found delinquent in seventy-five per cent of their work are either placed on probation or dropped from the register entirely. By vote of the council of administration, seventy-eight students have just been dropped for failure to pass in eleven hours' work. In addition to this, 490 were placed on probation but it is estimated that at least eighty per cent of these will make good at the end of the present semester.

**Stellar Football Performer
Chosen Wednesday Afternoon
to Captain Grapplers**

Paul Dobson, exponent extraordinary of the gentle art of football, was elected to captain the 1918 Cornhusker wrestling team Wednesday afternoon. Coach Otoupalik called a meeting of the men who represented Nebraska at Ames in the first meet of the year and conducted the election.

Dobson wrestles in the 175-pound class, and although lacking in experience, makes up for it by his aggressiveness. He put up a good battle against his opponent in the meet with the farmers and gives promise of developing into a valuable point winner before the end of the season.

Wrestling prospects are gradually picking up and it is expected that Coach Otoupalik will put a much more formidable team in the field for the next meet than appeared in the first contest.

Two professional wrestlers from the city have been frequent visitors at the wrestling class and have been giving valuable assistance in training the members of the team.
