**Radio Engineers May Enlist in Reserve Corps**

A new amendment has been added to the selective service regulations, making it possible for electrical engineers taking work in electrical communicating, to enlist in the Signal Enlisted Reserve Corps. This places the students in class 5 and enables them to complete their work. Upon finishing their training they are transferred to a signal corps school and later to an engineering branch of the army.

ing seniors. Further qualifications are that the student be a citizen of the United States or that he has declared his intention to become one. That he be a junior or senior in a technical school approved by the war department. He must be regularly enrolled and have completed satisfactorily the second year of the course leading to the degree of electrical engineer or an equivalent course, approved by the chief signal officer. He must also elect such special courses as are provided by his school to fit him for signal corps.
