

Cotner took the ball and punted. Nebraska recovered and Schellenberg shot a pass to Swanson which added 40 yards to the Cornhuskers' distance. Schellenberg advanced the ball 20 more yards on a forward pass and the game ended with the ball about 25 yards from Cotner's goal.
