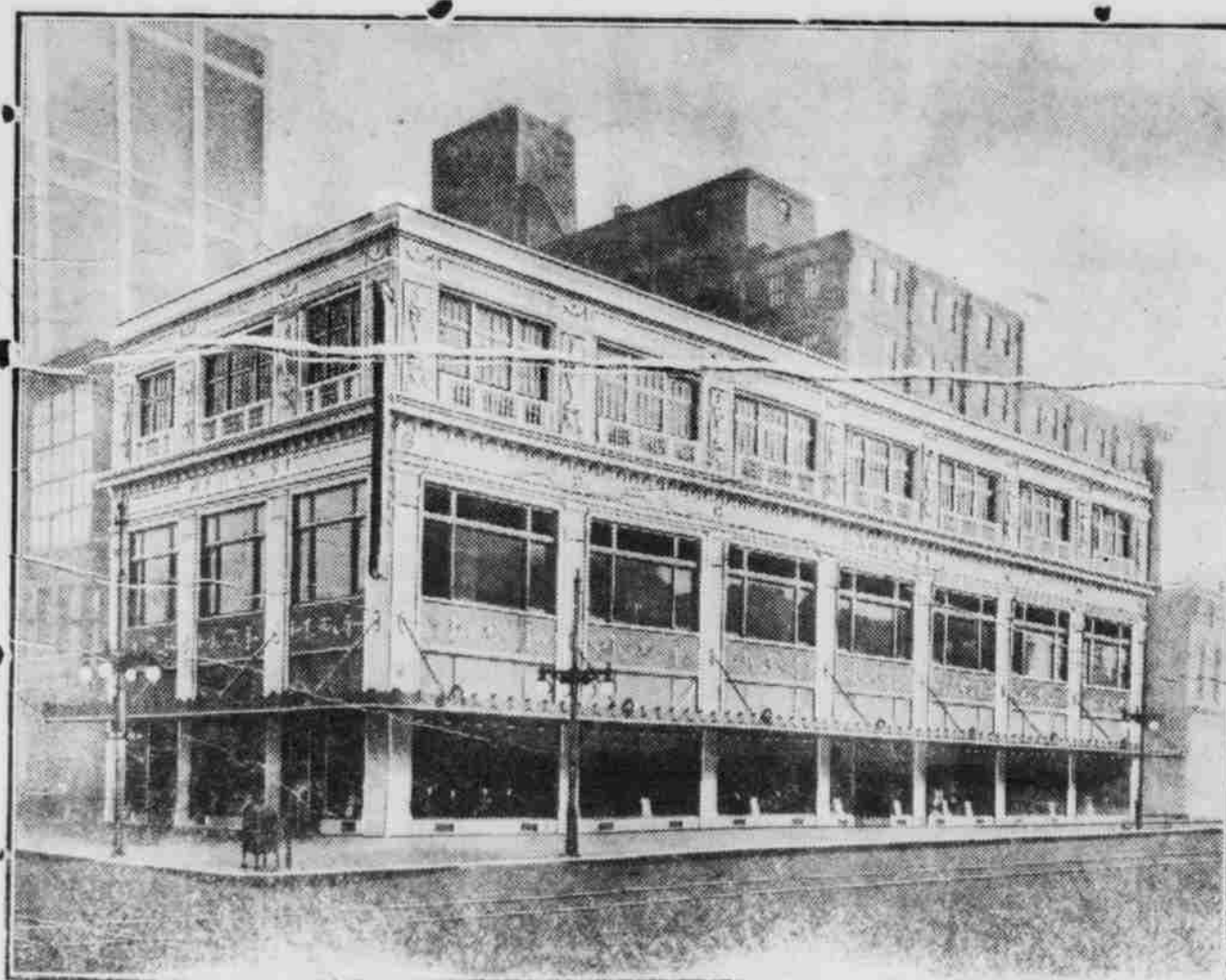

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE  
TO BE GIVEN STUDENTS**

At the request of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Chancellor Avery has appointed a committee to administer the loans that this board intends to make to Methodist students in the University of Nebraska in order to help them in continuing their education. This section of the work of the board for the United States is in charge of Rev. D. D. Forsyth of 111 Fifth avenue, New York City. Dr. Forsyth is a distinguished alumnus of the University of Nebraska.

The committee appointed by the Chancellor is as follows: Professor F. A. Staff of the Elm Park M. E. Church; Rev. W. E. J. Gratz, pastor of St. Paul M. E. Church; and Assistant Professor R. E. Cochran of Grace M. E. Church. These gentlemen will administer such loans to Methodist students as the general board may be able to grant to this university. It is not yet known how much money will be available, but the university authorities regard the movement as important in supplementing the student loan fund, a fund which has been in existence for several years. It will be recalled that this loan fund was started by a contribution from John R. Webster, now regent of the university, and that since his initial gift several important donations have been received.

While the total money now in the student loan fund amounts to only approximately \$5,000, some of the older universities have funds of \$50,000 or more, which are kept constantly revolving for the benefit of worthy students.
