I cannot imagine the Wilson who sailed for Europe lifting his head with this new yearning for the approval of "the opinion of outdoors." Nor can I hear him say, as our President exclaimed in opening his address yesterday:

"It warms my heart to see a great body of my fellow-citizens again, because in some respects during the recent months I have been very lonely indeed without your comradeship and counsel."

President Wilson left us a profound idealist. He returns to us first of all the practical, human father of our national family.
