Iowa—The populace was given a thrill when one of the co-eds from the agricultural engineering college drove a tractor through the main street.

Cornell—Plans have been completed for establishing a railroad ticket office on the campus. Pullman tickets will also be sold at the branch

office. Cornell furnished 3,030 commissioned men to the army, navy and marine corps during the war, according to a recent list compiled by the secretary of the university.

Minnesota—Seniors of the university are circulating a petition asking the faculty to repeal the ruling ordering final examinations for seniors.

Illinois—Fox-trotting on roller skates is the latest jazz perpetrated by the women at a skating party in the woman's gymnasium.

New York—Money amounting to \$35,000 has been paid to members of the S. A. T. C. for subsistence last fall.
