Referees will be on the courts at every hour when a game is scheduled.

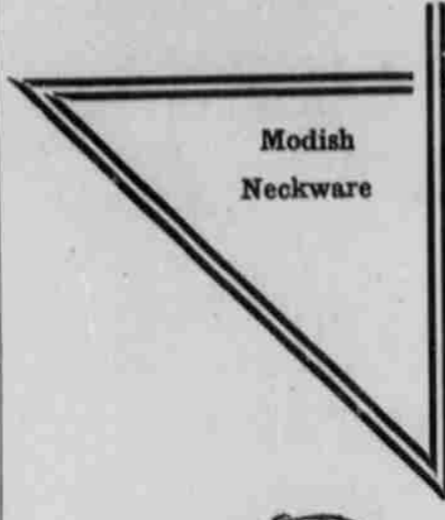
No match is legal without a referee. If match is not played off on account of player not appearing, the referee will draw names, and default the match to one of the absent players.

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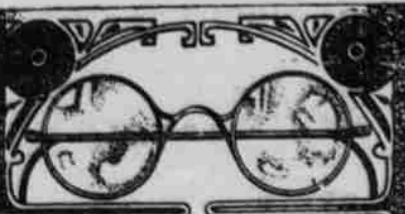
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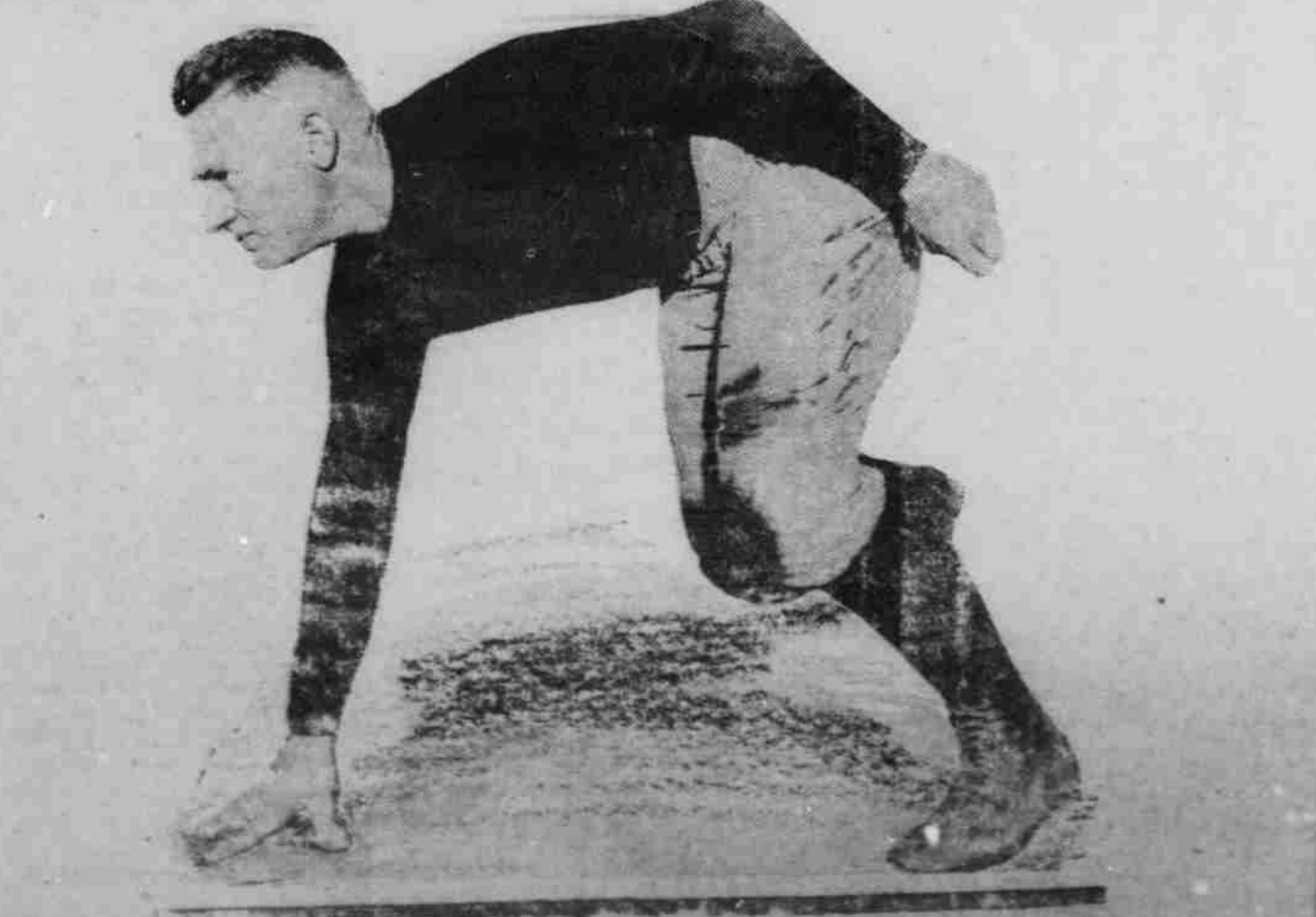
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
