**VARSITY BASEBALL RETURNS IN 1920**

Provost Lees Expected to Give Final Sanction for National Game.

Baseball is coming back to Nebraska. The King of American summer sports will reign supreme and the University rejoices. The war prevented this activity during the past several years, but this lull has only made the desire for the sport keener.

Coach Paul J. Schissler issued a call for men interested in the game to meet February 11. Although the game has not been played here for several years there have always been those who strongly favored the pastime and the enthusiastic meeting assured a 1920 Cornhusker aggregation representing the school on the diamond this spring and it will occupy a prominent place in athletics.

Provost James Lees, who is at present director of athletics, is very much in favor of the game. It is his ambition that every man in the University will be able to engage in some athletic work, and he thinks that baseball will give many men a chance for an "N" that otherwise would not be able to get one. Although final approval has not been given by Provost Lees, it is expected that his official sanction will be given when complete financial estimates are presented.

Coach Schissler, who will be in charge of the game, will be a most able director. He has a splendid amateur and professional record, having played on college teams and on the Hastings team in the Nebraska state league. "The staging of a successful baseball season," he said, "will require a great deal of work and presents a number of problems." The coach is anxious to get as large a number of men out for baseball as he can so that practice may get under way as soon as the weather permits.

**May Meet California.**

Nebraska has an abundance of excellent material and will have little trouble in developing a creditable team. As yet no games have been scheduled, but it is expected that the school will have no difficulty in scheduling games. The University of California nine is making an extended trip throughout the east this year, playing Syracuse, Pittsburg, Yale and Princeton, as well as several leading middle-western schools. The California authorities have wired the Nebraska athletic department asking for a game with the Cornhuskers and a Nebraska-California game will probably be one that will be interesting from a comparative standpoint, after the California team has met the strongest college teams in the country. In all probability a stiff schedule will face the Husker diamond artists.

Baseball will not only be an inter-university affair, but if present plans are carried out there will be an inter-college series in the University and possibly an inter-fraternity tournament.
