### HAMMOND EXPLAINS POSITION IN DISPUTE

registration, was the best method of settling the dispute.

"The views of the students in this matter were set out in petition which was presented to the Chancellor and which read as follows: 'We, the undersigned students of the University of Nebraska, believing that the selection of Frank D. Patty by the Student Publication Board as Editor of The Daily Nebraskan over Le Ross Hammond, the present Managing Editor, is unfair, contrary to the traditional custom of selection and detrimental to the best interest of the paper, respectfully petition the Chancellor and the Board of Regents, according to the by-laws of the Publication Board, to overrule the decision of the Board and appoint Le Ross Hammond as Editor, for the first semester of the year 1920-21.'

"Mr. Patty served on The Nebraskan for a part of a semester as a reporter and for a part of another semester as News Editor. In the middle of his semester as News Editor he resigned and from that time on devoted himself to other activities. He did not complete one full semester as News Editor and did not hold the position of Managing Editor.

"It is my honest personal belief that The Daily Nebraskan must depend for its success upon the tradition that those on its staff who render faithful, continuous and efficient service may look forward to advancement. The financial remuneration for work on The Daily Nebraskan being small, the only incentive for reporters and news editors is the hope of promotion for meritorious service and if this hope is denied them, the organization can not be maintained.

"During my service as Managing Editor of the paper, it was my earnest desire at all times to give the students the best publication possible. Whether I succeeded or not, is a question which is logically one for the subscribers to decide. I welcome an expression of their opinion in the referendum vote which is being taken this week.

"I regret very much that the present situation exists and, for the welfare of the University, I hope that a similar difficulty does not arise again. Personally, I am pleased that the students are to have the right to decide this question and I shall consider their decision final."

#### Procedure

The student will follow the procedure outlined below when he begins to register:

1. All new students will first consult registrar in U 111.
2. All, except new students, first secure enrollment instructions and a registration ticket at registrar's office for an hour in which to enroll and pay fees. Tickets and instructions will be given out Tuesday, September 14.
3. Place of enrollment:
  1. Engineering College. See instruction leaflet.
  2. Graduate College in Adm. 104.
  3. Law College in Law Building.
  4. Arts and Science College (except advisers of Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors, who may be consulted in departmental offices), Agriculture College, Business Administration Dental College, Pharmacy and Pre-Medic and Teachers College enroll in Memorial Hall. Admitted by ticket. Enter from Twelfth Street. Exit by west door.
4. Pay fees at Registrar's office. Admitted by ticket.
