in excess of tax levies ....\$ 665,860 The resource classified as University cash is all cash taken in by the University, including fees, the sale of farm products and all other collections. The endowment income comes from the land which the government gave to the University.

The recommendations for appropriations made to the legislature by the governor require a majority vote in both houses. If the requests had not been approved by the governor a three-fifths vote in both houses would be required to pass them. Thus 51 affirmative votes in the House of Representatives and 17 in the Senate are all that are needed to pass the bill introducing these recommendations, while, if the requests had been made by the Board of Regents and not approved by the governor, 20 senators and 60 representatives would have to vote for the appropriations in order that they be granted.
