

WANT UNIVERSITY MEN FOR FOUR SQUARE TEAMS

Secretary H. W. Kendall Asks Older Students to Help With Work Among High School Boys.

A call for four teams of four University men each to carry one week-end programs for the high school boys of some of the larger Nebraska towns has reached the Y. M. C. A. office. H. W. Kendall, district secretary for the territory including Nebraska has asked for young men to make up what he calls the "four-square" teams.

The University Y. M. C. A. has done this work during the year on a local basis, but the trips called for by the state director are a part of a comprehensive plan which he has begun. Mr. Kendall expects to reach the boys of thirty-two Nebraska towns with the inspiration which Christian college men can give. The first team has made arrangements to go to Ord for a series of meetings February 25 to 27.

The members of the "four-square" teams not only address the high school boys but they lead them in discussions and conduct athletic games and contests. The boys reached through the state campaign will be charted as to their physical, intellectual, devotional, and service development. This charting has been

arranged for under the Christian citizenship training program worked out by the national committee of the Y. M. C. A.

The University teams are being trained by Clyde Wilcox and his committee, who are assisted by Dr. D. E. Thomas. Dr. Thomas is head of this work as chairman of the Community Service Department of the United Christian program.

Owen R. Lovejoy, secretary of the National Child Labor Committee, and J. K. Coddling, warden of the Kansas penitentiary at Lansing are scheduled to speak at the twenty-first annual meeting of the Nebraska Conference of Social Workers February 13, 14 and 15. Headquarters will be at the Lindell Hotel. The majority of the meetings will be held in the assembly room there.

Mr. Lovejoy is a versatile, attractive speaker and is one of the best-known social workers in the United States. He is ex-president of the National Conference of Social Work. Sunday, February 13, he will give an address "What Society Owes the Child" at St. Paul's Methodist church. He will speak on "Child Labor and Poverty" at the luncheon at the Grand Hotel. Monday, and on "Education and the Child" at the Lindell Hotel two o'clock Monday afternoon.

Mr. Coddling will speak at Trinity Church, Sunday evening. At the Monday morning meeting he will talk on "The Intermediate Sentence Law" and on "County Boards of Child Welfare" under the general topic of "Administration and Law Enforcement."
