"N" Club Picture.

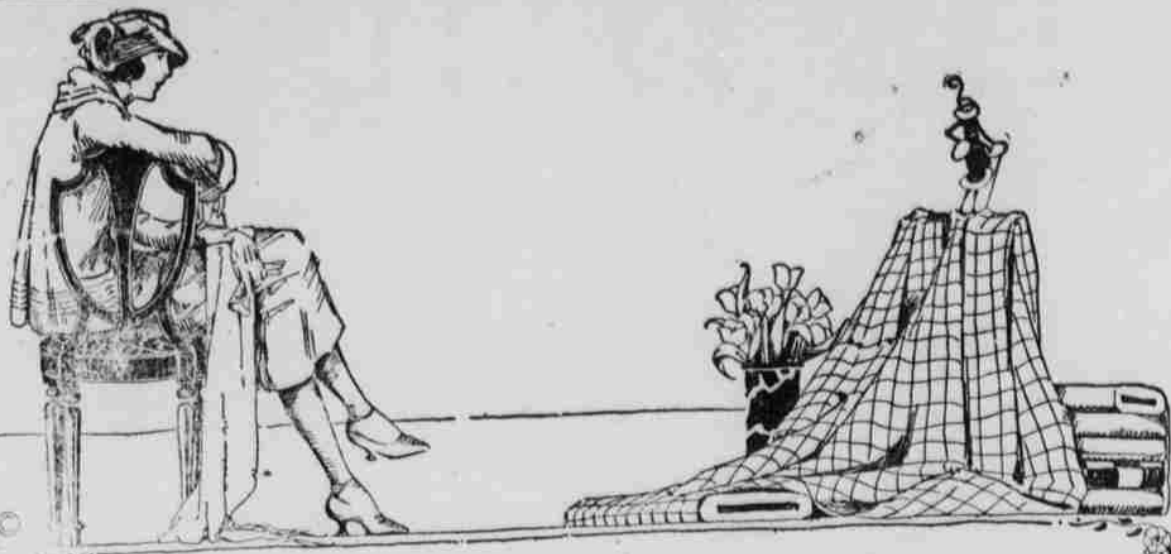
The "N" Club picture will be taken at Townsend's Studio, Saturday morning.
