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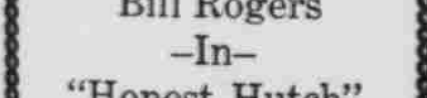

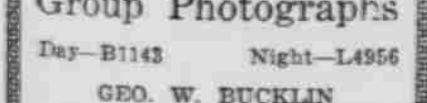

VISITS NEBRASKA**

Dean Lyn Scipio, Dean of Engineering at Robert's College, Constantinople, Turkey, spent Sunday and Monday in Lincoln as guest of Prof. C. E. Mickey. Dean Scipio is now in the United States on sabbatical leave

of absence and during this time will serve as director of the A. S. H. V. S. laboratories stationed at the United States Bureau of Mines, Pittsburgh. At present he is making a tour of the United States for the purpose of interesting the various engineering colleges in a series of research experiments with reference to the conservation of heat and the heating and ventilating of buildings.

He expects to visit Lincoln again in about three weeks and efforts will be made to have him speak at a special convocation and also before the Men's Faculty club on the present and past conditions in Turkey.
