He Had the Dough, He had the Looks—He knew He Had the Ciaas—his only black mark in the books—Was this, he lacked the Brass.

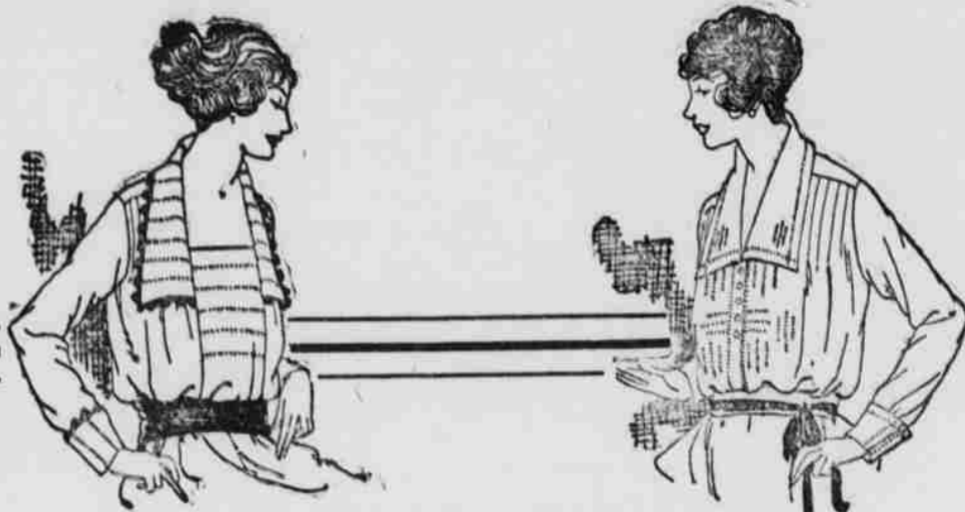
