hundred This is the eleventh rear of state high school tournaments in sport and the entry list has been constantly increasing, rising from

In 1911 the first Nebraska high
school tournament was held at Lincoln. Twenty-one teams were entered for the event. The honor of winning
the first tournament went to Beatrice Omala Central won the 1912
tournament in which twenty-five rams were entered. The Omaha fire won a $22-8$ victory from South Omaha
in the final game. University Place took the consolation tourney from
