Moses-Gibbons.

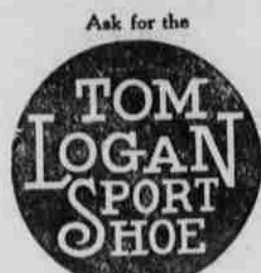
