ASSOCIATION CABINET TO BE INSTALLED ON FRIDAY

Y. M. C. A. Officials to Receive Office at Next Greater Nebraska Luncheon.

Members of the Y. M. C. A. cabinet for the coming year will be installed at the Greater Nebraska luncheon Friday noon at the Grand hotel. It was announced at the luncheon held last week. All men students and members of the faculty are invited to the installation which will follow the luncheon.

At the meeting last Friday C. Peterson, city attorney and former state senator, spoke on "Corporation Conscience." He traced the development of industry very briefly from the times when the manager of a business worked side by side with the employe up to the present time when the owner of a business very often does not know anything about the practical operation of the plant.

Mr. Peterson said that much of the present labor trouble was due to the fact that labor was drifting from representative control to autocratic management while political leaders were drawing politics away from representative control in the opposite direction. He declared that this condition must be remedied before conditions become as serious as they are in England today. Mr. Peterson recommended that all college men should become acquainted with the conditions in industry.

 For a long time yet.

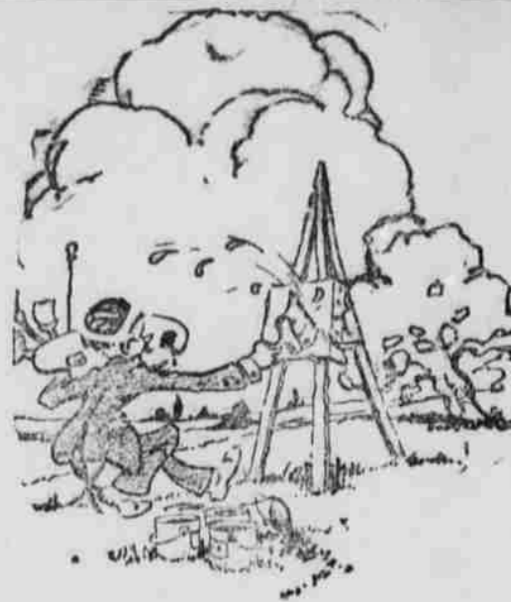
