

**Graduate College
Open To Holders
Of First Degrees**

Graduates from the undergraduate colleges of this institution, and from other colleges of equivalent rank, are admitted to the Graduate College on presentation of diplomas. But such entry does not in itself entitle the applicant to candidacy for a higher degree. He is entitled merely to enter subjects and courses which his undergraduate specialization has fitted him to pursue. The Dean registers such persons under the head of Graduate Students not Candidates for a Degree.

If the applicant desires to be entered as a candidate for the Master's Degree, he is sent, specifying the department or departments in which he wishes to study, to the chairman or chairmen concerned. He will be registered in the subjects and courses recommended for the first semester. If the preparation of the intending candidate is found deficient, he will be enrolled for undergraduate courses designated by departments consulted, along with such studies as will make up a practicable program.

The minimum time requirement for the degree of Master of Arts is one academic year, which must be spent in residence.

Candidates for the degree of Master will present themselves for two examinations:

(1) A written examination of two periods, viz: a three-hour period devoted to the major subject and a two hour period devoted to the minor subject. Where no minor is taken the second period shall be devoted to a secondary subject in the major department.

(2) An oral examination of two hours, which may include thesis examination.

Candidates for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy will present themselves for:

(1) A written examination of from four to six hours in the major subject.

(2) A written examination of from two to four hours in the minor subject.

(3) An oral examination of from two to three hours which may include the thesis examination. Any and all of these examinations may be given in two periods.

When the examination of the candidate has been passed successfully, a copy of his dissertation must be left for inspection in the Chancellor's office for a period of not less than two weeks before his graduation. A copy

of the dissertation in typewritten form must be filed with the librarian, and one hundred printed copies furnished him for public distribution. In lieu of immediate delivery of these copies, the librarian and the secretary of the board of regents are authorized to accept a bond, executed by the candidate, to ensure fulfillment of the requirement of publication.

serve as game refuges and in a variety of ways tend to conserve the natural resources of the state, and (6) offering attractive surroundings and facilities for recreation to neighborhood social gatherings, to campers from other parts of the state who would spend a vacation in one of these parks, and to tourists from other states who might be tempted by the attractiveness of the vicinity to linger on their journey.

These varied functions indicate the desirability of parks various in size and character, including those of large size so subdivided and supervised as to serve several interests. The state should so legislate as to provide for the acquirement of such tracts by purchase with state funds or with state and local funds combined, by trusteeship, and through group and individual donation. As a means of attracting the latter it should employ a thoroughly trained official, with permanency of appointment, and with funds at his disposal to have general supervision of all state parks. Experience has shown that careful handling of parks by a trained forester will make them to a considerable degree self-supporting. The number of interests involved and the need of a broad and comprehensive plan point to the desirability of selecting a representative advisory board to determine the necessary procedure."

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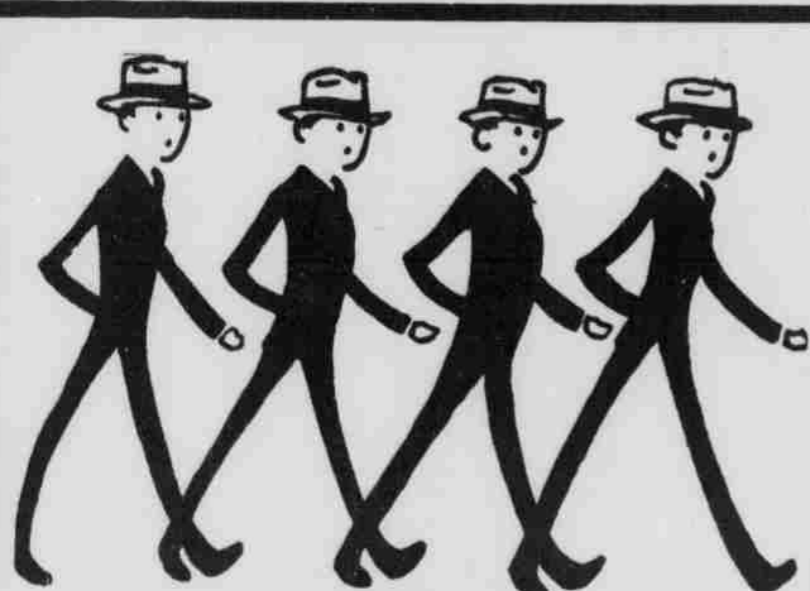
