

**UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO
OFFERS SCHOLARSHIPS**

Applicants Must Have Been Graduated From Standard College and Must Show Fitness for Work

The graduate school of social service administration of the University of Chicago offers for 1921-22 three assistantships and eight scholarships. The three junior assistantships carrying a stipend of \$600 each; three fellowships with a stipend of \$650 each; and five scholarships of \$150 each. The appointments will be for three of the four quarters of the year, and may be entered upon at the beginning of either the summer or the autumn quarter.

The requirements of candidates for these appointments are: Graduation from a standard college with evidence of high scholarship and of fitness for service in social work. Preference will be given to candidates who have had graduate work or have specialized in the social sciences in their undergraduate work.

Work Leads to Degrees

The work of the school leads to the graduate degrees, master of arts and doctor of philosophy. The three required to secure the master's degree depends in part upon the undergraduate work taken by the candidate. Six quarters are usually necessary for those who have had little or no undergraduate work in this field; but the degree has been taken in four quarters by students of high standing who

have specialized in the field as undergraduates.

Applications should be in the hands of the dean of the school of social service administration not later than May 15, 1921. The appropriate application form will be sent upon request. Further information may be obtained from Dean J. E. LeRossignol of the college of business administration.

**HOLD NATIONAL SCHOOL
FOR CLUB SECRETARIES**

Will Include Commercial Club Men, College Seniors and Graduate Students

The first session of the national school for commercial club secretaries will be held at Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois, July 18 to 30. The curriculum is designed for those who are at present engaged as secretaries and for college seniors and graduate students who may wish to qualify themselves to enter this work. This instruction will be given by regular members of the university faculty and by leading commercial organization secretaries.

The commercial organization secretaryship is rapidly becoming recognized as an attractive profession, and the national school for commercial secretaries has been established to help qualify men for this field of activity.

Those who attend this course will have attractive dormitory accommodations on the campus, which is on the shore of Lake Michigan. The tuition is \$30. Any one desiring further information should see Dean J. E. LeRossignol of the college of business administration.

**PROF. IVEY WRITES ON
DISTRIBUTION PROBLEMS**

The March, 1921, number of Administration, the journal of business analysis and control, contained an article written by Prof. Paul Wesley Ivey of the College of Business Administration on "The Manufacturer's Marketing Problem." Professor Ivey discusses the extensive readjustments of the factors in the system of distribution which have been brought about by the transformation of a seller's market into a buyer's market, and explains the various points of view of the manufacturer, jobber, and retailer on the resulting problems.

He points out where each has been integrating or taking over some of the functions of the other two; and shows that the struggle for business protection is at the root of the struggle for markets. He takes up the various kinds of dealer help which the manufacturer has adopted to get the cooperation of the retailer.


He shows that the decreasing cost stage of production is sought by the manufacturers not only for larger immediate profits, but also for a cushion of profits which serves as an insurance fund for the profitable continuance of the business during periods of depression and in spite of vigorous competition.
