

CAMPUS NOTES

The architects who designed Social Science Hall and Bessey Hall have been selected by Kansas University as consulting architects for their new \$4000,000 medical plant to be erected at Rosedale, Kansas. While the Chancellor of the University of Kansas was in the city a few weeks ago he made a very careful inspection of the new university buildings.

A year ago a delegation from Cornell University inspected the buildings here and expressed themselves as finding at Nebraska one of the few state institutions that was developing its building plan according to a pleasing and consistent plan. Recently Dean Mann of the College of Agriculture, who is making a study for a building campaign at Cornell, spent a day here. He was particularly pleased with the agricultural engineering building at the Farm Campus.

The extension division has had many calls from the high schools of the state for dramatic coaches. At present there are three persons in the field doing this work.

Mrs. Louise Brown is at Beaver City drilling the senior class for "The Fortune Hunter." Mrs. Brown coached the class play at Havelock and will fill some other engagements after finishing the work at Beaver City.

Mrs. Horace J. Young is at Ulysses coaching the class play. Other engagements that Mrs. Young has filled this year are: Pierce, Kiron, Iowa; Davenport, Bancroft, Falls City and DeWitt.

Miss Eleanor Fegg has been kept busy since in January with dramatic contests and class plays. Some of the places where she has been are: Callaway, Hastings, Plainview and Scribner.

Calls are coming in rapidly for engagements for Dr. Charles Fordyce of the department of educational measurements and research to undertake school surveys next fall. Several of the large cities have already secured his services.

The Bureau of Professional Service has received a notice that the French ministry of public instruction has openings for men as assistants in the French Lycees, colleges, and normal schools. The duties of an assistant are limited to two hours a day for conversation in English with French pupils. The remainder of his time may be devoted to study for his personal benefit. For many years these positions have been filled by Englishmen and have been very desirable appointments for studies of the French language and literature. This is the first time that these positions have been open to Americans.

Rev. Harry F. Huntington, Methodist student pastor of the University, will give the commencement addresses before the graduating classes in the high schools of Yutan, Bertrand, Nehawka, Wilber, Greenwood and Wahoo.

Dr. George L. Peltier, professor of plant pathology in the botany department, has recently published a paper entitled "The Influence of Temperature and Humidity on the Growth of the Citrus Canker Disease," a destructive disease of oranges, lemons, grapefruits, and other members of that group of flowering plants. This paper is the fourth publication by Dr. Peltier in connection with his studies of the disease. All of these papers have been published in the Journal of Agricultural Research of Washington.
