CHARLESTON, W. Va., Oct. 6.—Informal application for a charter of incorporation was made yesterday by the realm of West Virginia, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, according to Houston G. Young, secretary of state. Mr. Young declined to issue the charter. He said he made it plain to the applicant, who did not give his name, that the organization will not be granted a charter in this state.

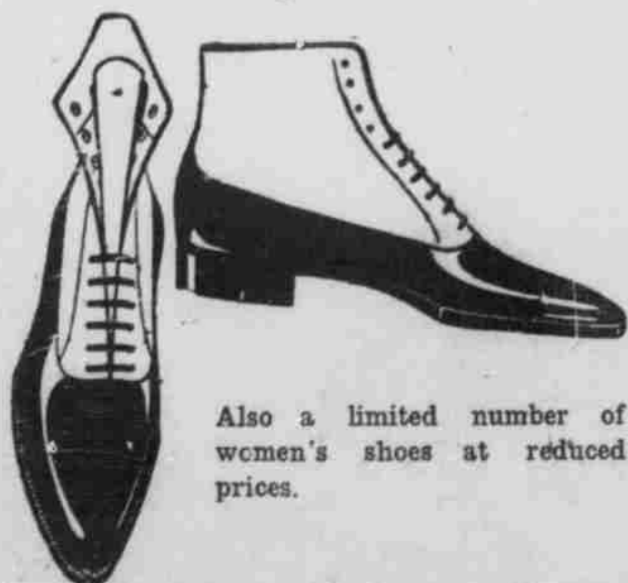
