

## APPLICATIONS DUE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Candidates for Rhodes Award Must Have Their Names in by October 29.

All applications for Rhodes scholarships must be in the hands of the secretary of the state committee by two weeks from Saturday. The secretary is Paul F. Good, Lincoln lawyer, a Rhodes scholar of 1914. Applications have been awarded since 1914. Applications must be in his hands by October 29.

Rhodes scholarships have been awarded since 1904. Some of the Nebraska men to receive the honor were:

Horace English in 1911. English was a professor at Wellesley for a long time and is now in Ohio.

Weldon Crosstron, from Nebraska Wesleyan in 1913. Now a pastor of a Methodist church in Detroit.

Paul F. Good, in 1914, now a Lincoln lawyer.

Paul Meant, 1916, of Yale. Attended Oberlin Divinity college when he received the appointment. His folks are from Orleans, Nebr.

There were no appointments during the war.

In the fall of 1919 two men were appointed, Ralph Wilson, from Creighton university in Omaha. He went to Oxford in January, 1920.

Alfred Rees from Nebraska university who went over in the fall of 1920.

Russell Peters of Omaha received the appointment in the fall of 1929. He was attending Cornell university at the time. He was to start work at Oxford this October.

In Oxford the method of instruction differs greatly from American schools. Each person is entered into a college and placed under a tutor who is directly in charge of him. This tutor advises him as to what books to read and what lectures to attend but the student has to do nothing but what he advises.

There are three examinations for the Englishmen entering the school. One at entrance time, one at the end of the first year and one at the end of the college course. Each student specializes in one subject and takes that only.

Applications for Rhodes scholars must first be approved by the university committee. These should be in the hands of Provost Lees a sufficient length of time before October 29 to allow the committee to review the candidates. Nebraska is entitled to five candidates.
