 but that settlement must be guaran-
 teed by the great nations of the world
 and Russia must be given to under-
 stand that any attempt to treat that
 agreement as "a scrap of paper" will
 be met by the opposition of the united
 forces of the signatory states. Then,
 only can armaments be reduced, as
 the maintenance of order, justice,
 and good faith in the relations with
 Russia will rest on the co-operation
 of all the great states of the world.
