INTERESTING SERVICES AT VESPERS TUESDAY

Injection Renders People Immune From Diphtheria, According to Director Lab.

That a vaccine which will render people immune from diphtheria has been discovered; and that this vaccine is being used on thousands of school children in New York, were statements made by Dr. W. H. Parks, director of the research laboratory of the New York board of health, in his address on "Recent Developments in the Control of Infectious Diseases" yesterday at 4:30 in the biology building.

The experiments which culminated in the discovery of a successful vaccine were made possible by the use of the Schick test for the presence of diphtheria toxin. At first the work was carried on by the use of guinea pigs and rabbits, but as the experiments became consistently successful the tests were made on people.

Reduces Death Rate.

"In New York city with the aid of this new vaccine, we have cut down the number of deaths from diphtheria to one-sixth of what it formerly was, and have reduced the number of cases to two-thirds of what it used to be," said Dr. Parks. "This means a great saving of human life in a city the size of New York where thousands of diphtheria cases are handled annually. —Daily Cardinal.
