often refused full credit to students entering their institutions from the Cornhusker school, because they say, Nebraska has too many holidays. To have the same rating as these eastern schools, Nebraska must have thirty-six full working weeks, that is weeks with six days of school each. The period from September 11 to June 2 covers thirty-eight weeks, leaving only two weeks for all the vacations of the year. Of these two weeks, twelve days are working days and these are the days which are in the air until the students decide just how they want them distributed.

The University of Nebraska is as good a school as there is in the country and students coming from here should be allowed full credit for their work anywhere. It is now up to the students to decide how they want the vacations, which they can have and still maintain in the high rating which Nebraska deserves, distributed over the year. The calendar for 1921-22 is now in the process of being made up and this question must be decided immediately.

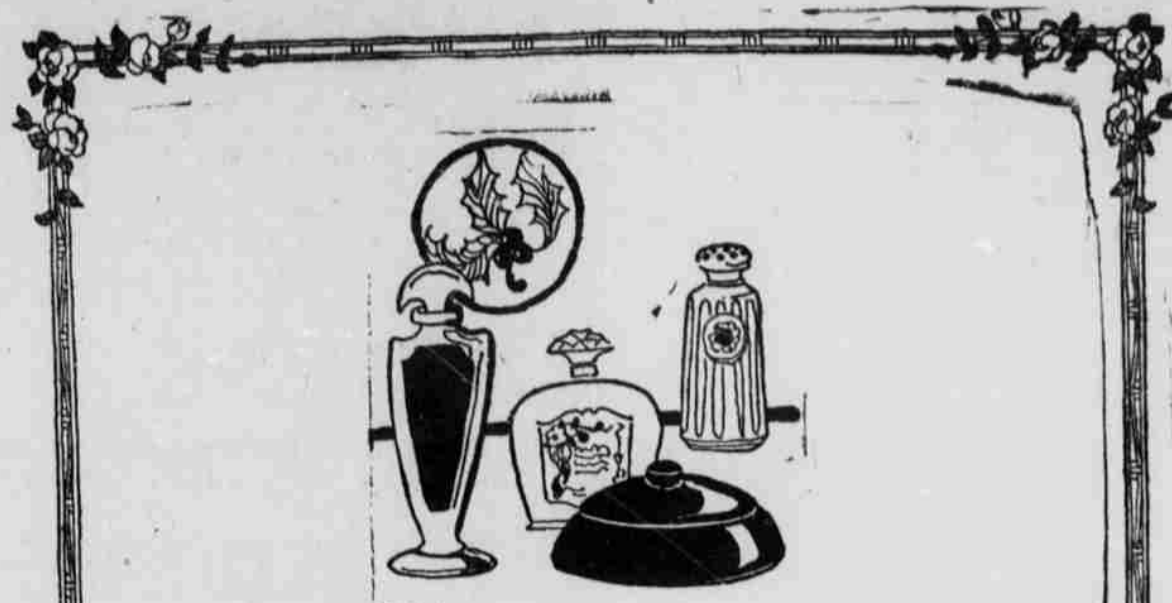

VISIT NEBRASKA TO SECURE DENTAL DATA

Ann Arbor Doctors Gather Information For Teaching Operative Technics And Dentistry.

For the purpose of gathering data on the teaching of operative technics and operative dentistry, Dr. John J. Travis, associate professor of operative dentistry and technics at the college of dental surgery at Ann Arbor, Mich., and Dr. Francis B. Vadder are visiting the University of Nebraska college of dentistry of which Dean Clyde Davis is the head.

These men are visiting and inspecting only three or four dental schools in the country, and picked the University of Nebraska as one of those deserving of inspection. They are gathering the data in order to improve the teaching of operative technics and dentistry at the Ann Arbor school. Other schools which they

have visited are Illinois, Iowa and Northwestern. In the 1921 hand book of higher educational dentistry which was published recently, the University of Nebraska college of dentistry is credited with being one of the first and highest registered schools.
